

### Pieced Backings for Quilts

When the batting and quilt top are placed over the quilt back on the long arm frame to be quilted, the quilter cannot see the quilt back.

As a quilt top is quilted, there is always some movement and shrinkage of the quilt.

Therefore, it is very difficult to place the quilt top so it lines up to a specific spot on the backing.

I try my best to line up the backing with the quilt top, but cannot guarantee exact placement.

I agree to let Donna Reznik of "Inthreadible Quilting" quilt my quilt top to my pieced backing with the understanding that it may not line up exactly as I want.

### Backings With a Pile

(Minkee, Fireside, Faux Fur, etc)

When stitching a quilt with a backing with a pile, it is common for the needle to pick up some of the pile from the backing and bring it through to the top of the quilt, creating little "dots" of pile showing on the top.

I agree to let Donna Reznik of "Inthreadible Quilting" quilt my quilt top to my backing with a pile with the understanding that some of the pile from the backing fabric may be seen on the top of the quilt.
